Waukesha South Families,

Welcome to that time of year when we start preparing for another great school year at Waukesha South High School! We are extremely excited to kick off this new year of continuing great educational opportunities and traditions here at the longest standing, four-year high school in Waukesha. For those of you who are new to the school, welcome to the family!

This year, we have decided to focus on the same three school goals that will help ensure each child gets a great education. Our entire staff will be developing goals around: instruction of writing, reading, inquiry, organization and collaboration; technology; and creating common curriculum that we can assess to best meet the needs of your child. To keep you well informed, here is what is new and what you need to be aware of this year.

New Schedule: The school day will be starting 15 minutes later this year! On Monday, first hour starts at 7:35 am which is the same time Academic Options starts on Tuesday through Friday. A copy of the new schedule is in the Spotlight for you to post on the refrigerator.

Registration: With iPads, a new student information system, and schedules, registration will be busy this year. We are working to set up a sleek station-by-station system this year that will walk you through every step to ensure you and your child are ready for the school year. Registration will include: handing in forms (health room, technology acceptable use, etc.), getting student iPads, registering for Infinite Campus, paying fees (which can be done online at home as well) and getting schedules to name a few. Please know that there will be no schedule changes allowed after September 1st unless there is an error or hole in a student's schedule. The dates of registration are different this year:

August 18 (4:30 - 7:30 pm) - Freshman

August 19 (4:30 - 7:30 pm) - Sophomores

August 20 (4:30 - 7:30 pm) - Juniors

August 21 (4:30 - 7:30 pm) - Seniors

August 22 (4:30 - 7:30 pm) - Make Up

Parents/guardians NEED to attend iPad rollout in order for their student to receive an iPad. There are forms that require a parent/guardian signature before an iPad will be issued.

Please know that this year we will not be handing out textbooks during registration (except for AP classes.

Other textbooks will be available the 1st week of school). We will also not be taking pictures. These will be done the first or second week of school. Having an Apple ID (see below) and all the forms filled out will decrease stress and make the registering process much faster.

Preparing for your Students iPad: Obtaining your student's iPad during registration is a big deal! To expedite the process, I would strongly encourage each family to come to registration with an Apple ID (that uses your student's school email address) already created. You can find out how to do this by going to the following link: <https://sites.google.com/a/waukesha.k12.wi.us/waukesha-one/parent-information/for-teachers>

Once created, there is a great opportunity to discuss appropriate use of the iPad as a family. For some families, only the parents may know the Apple ID and password. For other families, it may be that some Apps are not allowed. We hope to work with all of you to make iPads a great educational tool.

Infinite Campus: With a new Student Information System in place that meets the requirements of our State Department of Technology, there will be a learning curve. We hope to help you register for Infinite Campus, and once we all get used to the new system, there should be one place for you to check your student's attendance, grades, and fee payments. While it will be much easier than our old systems in the long run, please know that there will be some growing pains as parents, students, teachers, secretaries and administrators familiarize themselves with the system this year.

New Homework School-wide Policy: This is a NEW policy our school has developed last year. Homework is important. Often times, it helps us, as a school, give feedback to students on how they are doing or helps them prepare for important lessons the next day. Because of this, when students don't do homework, they are missing out on a great opportunity to practice honing their skills to perform their best on a summative assessment. South High School believes it important that each and every student put their best effort forth on all formative and summative assessments. For this reason, the following policies regarding homework will be in place for all classes here at South High School for the 2014-2015 School Year.

Every formative given to students must relate in some way to preparation for a summative assessment.

All formative work must be completed in a timely fashion to be eligible for retakes of summative assessments (when retakes are allowed).

Teachers can assign "due dates" and "deadlines." After a "deadline" has been reached, the student can no longer turn in any formative or summative assessments.

We are hoping that these three policies will help our students get more timely feedback, and work at a school that prepares them to be College and Career ready by the time they graduate.

Academic Options: South will continue to have an Academic Options period at the beginning of the day on Tuesdays-Fridays from 7:35-8:05. This will consist of three strands: just in time support, intervention support, and enrichment opportunities. We will continue to offer students Math and Reading interventions to help build skills based on data from their student assessments. Our building will also be offering more structured "Just in Time" supports for students not achieving proficiencies in classes. Students will be assigned to an instructor during our AO time period if they are not meeting minimal proficiencies in a class needed for graduation. Once proficiencies are met, the student will be removed from AO. Attendance will be taken during any offering during AO.

Attendance: This is a very important issue. For the past few years, South High School has been deducted points on our school report card for poor attendance. State Law allows parents to excuse their child no more than five (5) times a semester and no more than ten (10) times in a school year. Every absence counts even if there is a medical excuse, funeral, or emergency. Please know that our school will send a letter to your family once a student has reached 5 days and 10 days of absence to make you aware of your child's attendance. After ten (10) days, we must require that every absence be excused only through a doctor's note. Further, being on time is equally as important. We begin school at 7:35 am every Monday and Academic Options will begin at 7:35 every Tuesday through Friday. Showing up late to school means your child is missing out on crucial instructional time. Dropping your child off any time after 7:30 am will not allow your child the time they need to be prepared for their first hour class. Please know that an Assistant Principal will be contacting you to figure out a plan to get your child to school on time if tardiness is an ongoing issue. PLEASE, help South earn the report card grade it deserves by helping get your child to school often and on time. I thank you in advance for your support on this issue.

Field of Many Dreams: Our new athletic turf field will be ready for our first football game on Friday, August 22 at 7:00 p.m. I hope that you can attend the first game against Nicolet.

Southfest is being combined with **Open House** on September 10 from 6:00-8:00. The night will start in the auditorium at 6:00 p.m. The Silent Auction and Public Auction typically held at Southfest will occur at this event.

I truly am looking forward to getting to know all of you and growing our Blackshirt family. I firmly believe you and your child will love coming here.

Registration will be held in the auditorium lobby from 4:30 - 7:30 p.m. on August 18th-22nd. Students will receive their schedules and will pick up their iPads.

AP textbooks will be available for pick up in the library during registration. **Lockers WILL NOT be available until the first day of school.** Remember to bring a backpack/bag to ease the load of the textbooks.

If you are out of town during registration, please see Mrs. Huinker in the Administrative Office when you return from vacation. Be sure to complete the forms online. Picture retakes for both yearbook photos and ID pictures will be Tuesday, October 7th.

Parking permits, yearbooks, band fees, and locks will be available for purchase/payment at registration but will need to be paid for separately. Look for a table selling these items.

Textbooks


If you are taking an AP class, please stop in the library to pick up your textbooks during the following times:

Reporting an Absence or an Appointment

If your student is too sick to come to school, please call our attendance hotline at 970-3716 to report his/her absence. Please speak slowly and clearly to ensure that your child's attendance is recorded properly.

We are asking parents to please try to remember your child's physician, dental, or other appointments in the morning and have your student bring a letter indicating the appointment to the attendance office **before** the school day begins. This will allow us to write up a pass immediately for your student.

Phone calls to the attendance office to have your student removed from class due to a scheduled appointment should only be made **if the appointment is a last minute scheduling**. Using this process will alleviate interruption to classroom instruction.

The school office can become overwhelmed with messages and items to be delivered to students during the school day. Please limit delivery requests, including messages, to emergencies only. Thank you for your cooperation.

Student Medication

Any student who needs to take prescription medication during the school day must have a completed form signed by both the parent and the physician. This form should then be returned to the health room aide along with the medication for the student. Prescription medications must be in the original prescription container and labeled. The student is responsible for coming to the health room to take his/her medication. Parents are responsible for making certain that medication is filled as needed. The medication forms may be picked up from the health room aide.



The School District of Waukesha and South High School do not provide any nonprescription drugs to students for any reason. If a student would like to keep a nonprescription drug in the health room (Tylenol, Advil, Bayer, Benedryl, etc.), please fill out a nonprescription drug form and submit it to the health room aide along with the nonprescription drug in its original container. This will be labeled with the student's name and logged as it is administered to the student.

Municipal Truancy Ordinance: 11.065

At the January 26, 1999 meeting, the Common Council for the City of Waukesha approved a municipal ordinance designed to help the school district deal more effectively with students who have truancy problems. The ordinance allows for immediate consequences to students who refuse to stay in school or attend school.

Under the ordinance, truant students may be fined up to \$130 for each offense. Truant students are also required to appear before the municipal judge with their parents and the student's driver license may be suspended for up to 90 days. In all cases, the court will order the student to attend school regularly.

Under the compulsory attendance laws for the State of Wisconsin, students must attend school except when excused for illness, religious purposes, funeral, family emergency, or school function. Truancy is defined as missing any part of or all of a school day without a permissible excuse. This includes tardiness. Habitual truancy is defined by state law as having unexcused absences from school for all or part of five school days in a semester. In both cases, the student may be subjected to intervention from the municipal court. The new municipal ordinance allows the process to occur with immediate results.

In the case of habitual truancy, a student may also be referred to the Waukesha County Department of Health and Human Services.

2015 Senior Class - Smile! Senior Picture Deadline

Parents, your senior student's final year of high school looms just around the corner. Along with it, there are numerous decisions and choices, some of which you need to make soon.

One such decision concerns a senior picture. To ensure that a 2015 senior picture is included in the yearbook, it is advisable to make a studio appointment with a local photographer soon. Pictures must be taken over the summer to allow studios the necessary time for processing and delivery. After selecting a desirable proof, it usually takes four or five weeks to finish the order. Other parents are scheduling studio appointments already; thus, the longer you wait, the more difficult it will be for you to arrange a sitting convenient for you.



A professional picture is **not** required. However, there are certain specifics that must be met in order to be included in the yearbook:

- Vertical picture.
- Head and shoulders or head to waist poses only. Full length pictures make the senior so much smaller than the other students pictured on the page.
- No animals.
- No baseball caps, dark glasses, or objects that cover the face.
- No cleavage or midriffs.
- No strapless tops.
- **A hard copy of the picture is required.** A wallet size or 4x6 is preferred.

If you select a professional photographer, it is important to verify that the studio can guarantee to finish pictures before the November 1st yearbook deadline. Due to yearbook publisher deadlines, senior pictures cannot be accepted after November 1st. Each senior electing to submit a portrait in the yearbook assumes the personal responsibility of doing so on time. Pictures should be submitted to Mrs. Wagner.

After School and Monday Extended Detention

Tardiness, truancy, or misconduct may result in a detention to be served in the after-school detention room. A student will receive advance notice of at least 24 hours before a detention must be served. Detention is from 3:05 p.m. until 3:35 p.m. Monday through Friday. The door will be closed at 3:05 p.m. with no admittance after that time. Failure to serve an after-school detention will result in a Monday Extended detention and/or other consequences.

Monday Extended Detention is held from 3:15 p.m. until 5:45 p.m. Extended detentions are served in the library. Not serving Monday Extended Detentions will result in in-school or out-of school suspension or municipal citation.

Food, drink, cell phones, and iPods are not allowed. Detentions are to be used for quiet study or reading. Talking and sleeping will not be permitted.

Students at ANY Alternative Off-Campus Site

If you are a student at Harvey Philip, the Lauer Center, HSED or any other alternative site you must still register, pay the \$90.00 course fee and get a student ID.

Board Policy & State Law Sexual Harassment Statement

Harassment is a form of misconduct, which undermines the integrity of the district's employment and academic relationships. All employees and students must be allowed to work in an environment free from unsolicited and unwelcome sexual overtures. Sexual harassment does not refer to occasional compliments. It refers to behavior which is not welcome, which is personally offensive, which debilitates morale, and which therefore interferes with the working or learning effectiveness of its victims and their peers. Individuals who experience sexual harassment should make it clear that such behavior is offensive to them and may process a complaint pursuant to this policy. Sexual harassment may include actions such as:

- Sexual oriented verbal "kidding" or abuse
- Subtle pressure for sexual activity
- Sexual contact as defined by statutes
- Demands for sexual favors accompanied by implied or overt promises of preferential treatment or threats concerning an individual's employment or academic status.

Sexual harassment is a prohibited action when it results in discrimination for or against a student on the basis of conduct not related to their learning performance. Such practice would include any academic action that is based upon an individual's acceptance of, resistance to, or refusal of sexual overtures. This form of sexual harassment may be difficult for students to cope with when individuals offer or threaten to use the power of their position to control, influence, or affect the career, salary, or job of another employee or academic status of a student in exchange for sexual favors.

In fulfilling our obligation to maintain a positive and productive working and learning environment, the district will make every effort to halt any harassment of which it becomes aware by calling attention to this policy or by more direct disciplinary action, if necessary.

Any person who believes he or she has been sexually harassed may file a written or oral complaint with their immediate supervisor, building principal, or the executive director of human resources. A complaint procedure is then followed.





The Waukesha South High School Dress Code is as follows:

For Boys

- No visible boxers/undergarments
- No loose or low-riding pants (not below hips)
- No muscle shirts


For Girls

- Fingertip rule applies to short skirts
- No strapless tops, halter tops, single shoulder straps, off the shoulder straps
- No bare midriffs
- No visible bra straps/undergarments
- No low-cut shirts/visible cleavage

For All Students

- Hats, hoods, bandanas, and other headwear may not be worn during the school day unless approved by administration
- Coats/jackets are not to be worn to class
- Clothing should not contain vulgarity or obscenity, sexual innuendo, or the promotion of illegal products

Students will receive the application information at that time. For students that qualify, the induction ceremony will be April 1st, 2015.

Also watch for a magazine fundraiser to help pay for some of the needed membership and induction requirements that are a part of the National Honor Society induction ceremony.

What You Need to Know about the PSAT

PSAT/NMSQT stands for Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. It is the best indicator of how well you will perform on the **SAT**. The SAT is a college admissions test similar to the ACT. If your child is planning on taking the ACT, you may decide not to take the PSAT. **TYPICALLY, THIS IS A JUNIOR LEVEL TEST. ONLY JUNIORS WHO TAKE IT WILL BE ENTERED IN THE NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION.**

Who should take the test?

PRIMARILY JUNIORS should take the PSAT/NMSQT. All students are allowed to take it, but only juniors can take the test to enter into competitions for the scholarship programs conducted by NMSC and to prepare for the SAT. If you are a sophomore taking high level classes and a challenging course load, you may want to take the test to receive personalized feedback on academic skills relating to college success. Taking the test during your sophomore year will give you more time to work on problem areas (if need be) before you start applying to colleges. **This competition is VERY competitive. If your child does not do well on standardized tests, it may not be in her/his best interest to take this test. We would not advise that special education students take this test if they have a specific learning disability in the area of reading, math, or processing. It may be very frustrating to take.**

What is on the PSAT/NMSQT?

The test consists of five sections: two 25-minute critical reading sections, two 25-minute math sections, and one 30-minute writing skills section. The critical reading sections measure your knowledge of the meanings of words and sentence structure and measure your ability to read and think carefully about reading passages. The math sections measure your knowledge of numbers and operations; algebra and functions; geometry and measurement; and data analysis, statistics, and probability. The writing skills section measures your capability to communicate ideas clearly, to recognize errors in usage and structure, and to use language with sensitivity to meaning.

Will colleges use my PSAT scores in determining whether or not I am admitted?

Colleges rarely see your PSAT/NMSQT scores, and the scores are not used to influence decisions on college admission. Try not to worry about the PSAT/NMSQT, but instead, use it as a tool to help gauge what you need to improve upon for the SAT.

When should I take the test?

The PSAT/NMSQT is administered by high schools each October. You must sign up for the test at your high school or a high school in your community. Contact your high school counselor for information on registering for the PSAT/NMSQT and learning the correct date, time, and location that your school will give the test.

Is a fee required to take the test?

There is a \$14 fee for the PSAT/NMSQT. There are a limited number of fee waivers available to juniors from low-income families who can't afford the test fee. Contact your high school counselor for more information on the test fee amount and fee waivers.

If you plan to take the PSAT/NMSQT, be sure to pick up the Official Student Guide to the PSAT/NMSQT from your guidance office in mid-September. For more information on the PSAT/NMSQT, please visit www.collegeboard.com.

Why do I need to take the PSAT/NMSQT?

Reasons to take the PSAT/NMSQT include:

- To get feedback on your strengths and weaknesses of scholastic skills.
- To enter the competition for scholarships from the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC).
- To prepare for the SAT.
- To receive information from colleges by checking "yes" to Student Search Service.

What You Need to Know about the PSAT

Sign-up procedure (remember, this is typically a junior level test):

Sign up for the PSAT/NMSQT test (Preliminary SAT®/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) by logging on to **www.TotalRegistration.net/PSAT/502390**. The sign-up window runs from August 18-September 15. This is the final day to sign-up as tests must be ordered and there are strict ordering deadlines.

The standardized test provides firsthand practice for the SAT, which is similar to the ACT and used by many colleges and universities for admissions. It also automatically enters you in the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) scholarship programs.

Great reasons for taking the PSAT are to see how student performance on an admissions test might compare with that of others applying to college and to enter the competition for scholarships from the National Merit Scholarship Corporation as well as helping to prepare for the SAT by experiencing the kinds of questions that are on the SAT. **The only way to enter the competition is to take the PSAT in October as a junior!**

What Students Should Bring to the Exam on October 18, 2014, in the library at South.

On test day, students should bring:

- Two No. 2 pencils
- An approved calculator
- Social security number (optional)
- Email address (optional). Students can opt to receive information about educational opportunities and financial aid via email from colleges, universities, some scholarship programs, College Board programs, and nonprofit organizations whose mission and offerings supplement the path to higher education.

During the test, students may have nothing on their desks but:

- A test book
- An answer sheet
- No. 2 pencils with erasers
- For math sections only, a calculator

Prohibited items:

◇Watch alarms ◇Handheld electronic devices, including cell phones and pagers (power must be turned off to pagers, cell phones, and handheld computers) ◇Protractors; compasses; rulers ◇Dictionaries or other books (there are no exceptions, even if English is not a student's first language) ◇Pamphlets ◇Papers of any kind ◇Highlighters and colored pens or pencils ◇Listening, recording, copying, or photographic devices (including watches and cell phones that contain cameras) ◇Food and beverages, including bottled water, unless approved for medical reasons


Three Sport Achievement Award


